



North Valley District Cardboard Box Derby

Saturday, March 3, 2018 at Blue Mountain Ski Area

Meet at Camp Spirit at 7:45 AM – We will leave no later than 8:00 AM

Cost is \$5 (includes patch)

Registration for the race starts at 8:30 AM

Race starts promptly at 9:30 AM and ends by 11:00 AM

What is a Cardboard Box Derby? It is a sled made out of cardboard and held together with tape, glue or string which will be used to ride down a snow covered hill! So join the fun and build a wild contraption prior to race day!

There will be awards for: The 2 Longest Runs, Most Scout Spirit and Best Design!

This event is open to all Scouts. Multiple sled entries are allowed, 2-4 scouts per sled. Must be registered to race!

Scouts must construct their own cardboard sleds. The sleds can only have 2 to 4 Scouts.

All participants must wear a helmet when racing! Bicycle helmets are permitted.

Each group of Scouts is responsible for coordinating with a parent or leader to provide transportation to and from Blue Mountain for themselves and their sled.

Sled Rules, Blue Mountain Release Form, and the Troop 72 Permission Form are attached.

RULES & SLED DESIGN

1. Two to four Scouts per sled.
2. All cardboard sleds must be built solely of cardboard, tape, string, glue, and paper. Sleds may be colored and painted. Tape is permissible on the surface of the sled where it meets the snow. Any other material in any part of the sled is grounds for disqualification.
3. Sleds cannot be built on the day of the race at the mountain. However, modifications are allowed to be made to the sled if necessary.
4. Use of lubricants of any kind on the bottom of the sled is grounds for disqualification. ~*A Scout is Trustworthy.*
5. A sled cannot be completely enclosed with scouts inside. There must be an opening on the top or back.
6. Anchors of any kind as well as other braking devices are unnecessary and prohibited.
7. All participants must wear a helmet and appropriate clothing.
8. No buckling, tying or strapping participants into sleds.
9. Sleds are to check in at designated sled pit area for sled inspection. All sleds will be assigned a number in the order they are checked in. Sleds must be present in the pit area for Judging.
10. Each scout and sled will get only one run down the course. Should a sled rollover it must clear the runway as soon as it comes to a stop. If a sled comes to a stop and cannot make it all the way down under its own momentum the sled must clear the runway.
11. Each team is responsible for clearing the mountain of their sled, as well as any debris from it, after their run. Participants are expected to take their sled home with them. Be Scouts and *Leave No Trace!*
12. Everyone must register prior to the event. All participants must sign a release form; less than 18 years of age require a parental consent. Forms will be available at registration and on-line. Scouts from other Districts are welcome.
13. Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the Judges. The decision of the event committee concerning awards or disqualification is final.
14. ANY unsportsmanlike conduct is grounds for disqualification.
15. All teams must adhere strictly to the rules or they will not be allowed to race.

IN CONSIDERATION OF BEING ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CARDBOARD BOX DERBY AT BLUE MOUNTAIN RESORT, I AGREE THAT I WILL NOT SUE THE TUTHILL CORPORATION DBA BLUE MOUNTAIN RESORT, ITS OWNERS, OPERATORS, OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, AGENTS, SERVANTS AND EMPLOYEES (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO COLLECTIVELY AS "BLUE MOUNTAIN ") AND WILL RELEASE BLUE MOUNTAIN FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY IF I OR ANY MEMBER OF MY FAMILY IS INJURED WHILE USING ANY OF THE BLUE MOUNTAIN FACILITIES OR WHILE BEING PRESENT AT THE FACILITIES, EVEN IF I CONTEND THAT SUCH INJURIES ARE THE RESULT OF NEGLIGENCE, INCLUDING GROSS NEGLIGENCE, OR ANY OTHER IMPROPER CONDUCT FOR WHICH A RELEASE IS NOT CONTRARY TO PUBLIC POLICY, ON THE PART OF BLUE MOUNTAIN . I FURTHER AGREE THAT I WILL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS BLUE MOUNTAIN FROM ANY LOSS, LIABILITY, DAMAGE OR COST OF ANY KIND THAT MAY OCCUR AS THE RESULT OF ANY INJURY TO MYSELF, TO ANY MEMBER OF MY FAMILY OR TO ANY PERSON FOR WHOM I AM SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT, EVEN IF IT IS CONTENDED THAT ANY SUCH INJURY WAS CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE, INCLUDING GROSS NEGLIGENCE, OR ANY OTHER IMPROPER CONDUCT FOR WHICH A RELEASE IS NOT CONTRARY TO PUBLIC POLICY, ON THE PART OF BLUE MOUNTAIN.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if I sue Blue Mountain, I agree that I will only sue it, whether it be on my own behalf or on behalf of a family member, in the Court of Common Pleas of Carbon County or in the United States District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania and further agree that any and all disputes which might arise between Blue Mountain and myself shall be litigated exclusively in one of said Courts. I understand and agree that the laws of Pennsylvania govern this Agreement. I further agree that if any part of this Agreement is determined to be unenforceable, all other parts shall be given full force and effect.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RISKS

Skiing, snowboarding, and other snow sliding activities (hereinafter referred to collectively as "Snow Sports"), including the use of lifts, are dangerous sports with inherent and other risks. These risks include but are not limited to, variations in snow, steepness and terrain, trail side drop-offs, ice and icy conditions, moguls, rocks, trees, and other forms of forest growth or debris (above or below the surface), bare spots, lift towers, utility lines, poles and guy wires, snowmaking equipment and component parts, trail fences and control nets and the absence of such fences and nets, and other forms of natural or man-made obstacles on and/or off designated trails, as well as collisions with equipment, obstacles or other skiers; trail conditions vary constantly because of weather changes and skier use. These are some of the risks of snow sports. All the inherent and other risks of snow sports present the risk of serious and/or fatal injury.

I have read and understood the foregoing **AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE AND ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS**, and I am voluntarily signing below, intending to be legally bound hereby. If I am signing on behalf of a minor child, I represent and warrant that I am doing so with the consent and approval of my spouse (if any) and I understand that I may be giving up the rights of my child and spouse to sue as well as giving up my own right to sue.

I hereby give permission for Blue Mountain to use any photograph or video of me taken during participation for use in commercial or non-commercial publicity.

I hereby give permission to receive a sms message from Blue Mountain Resort. This message will include the option to discontinue receiving sms messages from the resort.

Those 17 years of age and younger must have the signature of their parent or legal guardian.
