Come spend Friday night through Sunday morning fishing and camping in Clark Creek located at State Game Lands 211 – located at the junction of the Appalachian Trail and PA Route 325. This campout is all about having fun fishing and camping. We can keep and cook the trout so everyone will have a chance to try the fish we catch – can't get much fresher than that. This is a Backpack-style camping event with Patrol cooking so anyone who wants to attend can sign up.

What to Bring: Backpack style camping and Patrol cooking. Standard tent camping gear – Personal tent if you have one (troop tents will be available), warm sleeping bag, sleeping pad, extra blankets, pillow, spare clothing (pants, shirt, socks and warm sweatshirt or jacket and boots/shoes), hat, rain gear, flashlight, and a camp chair.

Meals: We will discuss meals and shopping details after our Monday April 7 meeting. Meal planning will be for Friday night snack, Saturday Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner and Dessert and Sunday Breakfast. **Please eat dinner before arriving on Friday night.**

Advancement Opportunities: While the focus of this event is on having fun, we will be working on completing some requirements for the Cooking, Camping and Fishing Merit Badges. We will also be offering an afternoon hike to see some local historical sights – The General (abandon mining shovel), Boxcar Rocks/Chinese Wall rock formation and the Ruins of Victoria Furnace.
